Primary objectives

- Most objectives are dependent directly on motive for extension of resources.
- It includes objectives like growth, welfare, money saving etc.
- They are predominant in under developed/developing countries.

Secondary objectives

- They cover low material objectives from primary objectives and transfer to goals of higher value.
- It concerned with money saving, productivity and contribution to employment (GDP) and profits.
- They are dominant in developed countries.

Measuring HDI → The HDI ranks the countries based on their performance in the areas of health, education, access to resources. These ranking are based on score between 0 to 1, that country earns from HDI.

The indicator of HDI are a higher life expectancy means that people have a greater chance of living longer & healthier lives. The adult literacy rate & the gross enrolment ratio represent the access to knowledge. Access to resources → The number of adults who are able to read & write. The number of children enrolled in schools.

→ The greater level of HD.

Four pillars - equity, sustainability, productivity & empowerment.

- Equity refers to making equal access to opportunities available for everybody. Equal access to people of their gender, race, income & in India case, caste.
- Sustainability means continuity in the availability of opportunities. To have sustainable human development, each generation must have same opportunities.
- Productivity here means human capital work. Such productivity must be constantly increased by building capability.
- Empowerment mean to have people the power to make choice, such power come from increasing freedom & capability.

Human development is defined as the process of enlarging people's freedom and opportunities and improving their well-being. Human development is about the real freedom ordinary people have to decide who to be, what to do, and how to live.

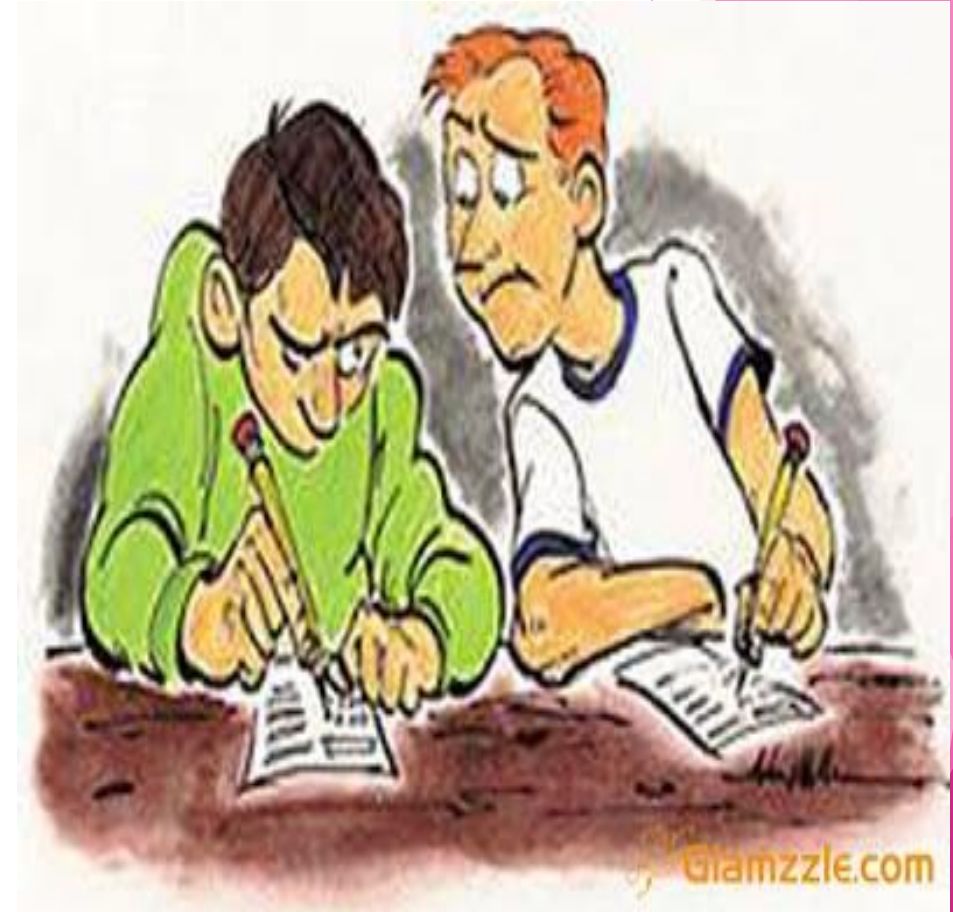
